This WHIRDEC meeting was the occasion to discuss with the EU Commission, represented by Dr. Alf FUESSEL and Eva CAMARA.

Traceability of equine animal and implementation of the AHL (Animal Health Law) were important topics of this session.

The EU regulation is complex and implementation of new rules takes time; this will probably impact the organization for breeding societies according to decision taken by Members States. The WBFSH is a link to forward the information to the Stud Book representative and support them by keeping the information available about the EU regulation which concerns most of the WBFSH



members, as it determines and/or conditions the common rules about animals separately from breeding programs.

TRACEABILITY OF GENETIC MATERIAL

The Traceability of Genetical Material is a sensitive subject which concerns multiples actors of the industry.

The WBFSH advises and reminds to members the importance of sanitary certificates; and publishes/forwards articles on this topic.

An ongoing study, by a German student, shows the diversity and evolution of breeding techniques and the importance of regulation to avoid fraud and misunderstanding about registration of provenance of genetical material.
