Question 1:

"What are the main welfare issues in starting to work young horses, and where do you see the greatest potential for abuse?"

- Lack of education
- Need of better handling
- Need for common guidelines







Question 2:

"How would an ideal young stallions selection process look like in the context of welfare?"

- Change of terminology (e.g. work with young horses)
- Social licence/ Guidelines
- Education on foal handling
- Educate breeders on how to handle horses (not only trainers)
- Understanding of the specific needs of individual horses
- Find a balance between testing and the natural ability of a horse
- Seperation of selection/training and commercial purposes







Question 3:

"What regulations are already in place in your countries to protect the welfare of foals and young horses?"

- Only a few countries have rules
- Big variation of rules
 - => need for common guidelines between studbooks

Question 4:

"What other animal welfare iusses will affect horse breeding in the near future, and what should be regulated or forbidden?"

 - foal jumping
 - Problems arising from new breeding techniques

 - Transport
 - Breeding of defects
 - Medication
